Remainder of building of regular coursed lias with simple cornice. Porch has brick gable with string course. Old tile roof. L-plan. Small church. 1840-42. Attributed to William Butterfield (VCH), but attribution not accepted by Paul Thompson. Built for the Knottesford Fortescue family. Regular coursed lias with limestone ashlar dressings. Tile roofs with coped gables. Aisled nave and chancel, north vestry. Early English style. 4-bay nave, 2-bay chancel. Angle buttresses and lancets with continuous hood moulds throughout. Chancel has triple east lancets with string course at sill, and quatrefoil above. Buttresses with gablets. Gable has foliated cross. Single south window. Roof has corbel table. Small north door in lean-to porch with east window. South aisle has 4 windows and east window; north aisle has 3 north windows only. Nave and chancel roof in one; aisles have lean-to roofs of same pitch, but slightly lower. West entrance between 2 lancets has chamfered arched doorway with stilted outer arch, and plank door with ironwork. String course at sill level continued up over door as gable with stiff-leaf finial. Pointed elliptical window above has moulded surround. Gable has small louvred wood bellcote. Far-projecting vestry, possibly a later addition, at right angles to north aisle, has west door with hood mould continued across wall. North window. Blank east wall of imitation ashlar cement. Interior: Plastered or whitewashed walls. Chancel has 2 pairs of sedilia. Small elaborate niche and bracket on north wall has trefoiled arch with shafts and gable, and bracket supported on stiff-leaves clasped in a hand. Elaborate painting, stencilling and gilding on every surface, including panelled wagon roof. Encaustic tile paving. Chancel arch on short colonette corbels. Nave has 4-bay arcade of 2 chamfered orders and round piers with 4 fillets. West internal porch, gallery over west arch and west wall of aisles elaborately painted and stencilled. Queen strut roof with arched braces on colonnette corbels. Narrow aisles, lower than arcade. Walls covered with scenes from the life of Christ painted in monochrome on zinc sheets, said to have been painted by the incumbent c.1870. Fittings: Arcaded stone altar. Carved stone pulpit with later monochrome paintings c.1870. Cylindrical stone font with carved interlace ornament, and elaborate ironwork on lid. Stained glass: East window c.1857, south aisle east mid C19; good quality medieval style work. Sculpture: Flemish relief of c.1520 (Buildings of England) on west wall. A good, very largely complete example of a Tractarian-influenced church interior. I Farmhouse and attached dairy. Early C16, altered and refaced in C19; mid-C17 dairy. Farmhouse originally timber-framed with wattle and daub and brick infill, almost completely underbuilt and refaced in C19 brick, save for most of cross-wing and dairy which are of regularly coursed lias rubble with some timber framing surviving to upper level of the former; plain tile roofs.

PLAN: Comprises a 3-bay hall range aligned east-west with a slightly later 2-bay cross-wing projecting to the north at the west end, the hall range originally consisting of a chamber bay, open hall bay and service bay and the cross-wing housing a kitchen open to the roof. A chamber was added over the service bay and a large chimney inserted in part of the former hall in the mid-C17; the stone dairy was added to the north end of the cross-wing at about this time. After this, the house was little altered save for the insertion of an upper floor in the kitchen range until the mid-C19, which is probably also the date of the lean-to dairy attached to the hall range.

EXTERIOR: South side has blind gable of cross-wing to left; main range with late C20 plank door to left and late C20 leaded casements to left and right of centre, latter with segmental head; gabled eaves dormers with leaded casements to left and right of prominent axial ridge stack with corbelled capping; all the casements are 2 light except the lower left which is of 3. Cross-wing has exposed square timber framing to upper floor on west side; 2 late C20 single-light leaded casements and plank door on ground floor and 3 late C20 2-light leaded casements on first floor; exposed queen-post truss to north gable end. North side of main range has 2 gabled eaves dormers, a late C20 leaded casement to centre and plank door to right; lean-to dairy addition to left of centre. Stone dairy attached to north gable end of cross-wing has half-hipped roof and late C20 leaded casements; external stone steps on east side leading to plank door with gable breaking eaves.

INTERIOR: Hall range has beam marking position of former partition to right of south door; late C20 replica of Victorian cast-iron range in fireplace; stone flag floor. C20 stone flag floor in kitchen that has partly reconstructed wash boiler next to fireplace. Plank doors throughout; stone shelves in lean-to dairy. Wide floor boards and exposed wall framing to both ranges. Hall range has exposed clasped-purlin queen-post roof in 3 bays with curved windbraces and braces to tie beams; some smoke blackening and evidence for a smoke louvre; identical roof in 2 bays to cross-wing, also with smoke blackening.

HISTORY: The hall range has been dated through dendrochronology to c.1514 and it is clear that the cross-wing was added very shortly afterwards. Recent research has shown that this is the house referred to in 1587 as previously occupied by Agnes Arden, widow, who would have taken it over after the death of her husband, Robert in 1556. Robert and Agnes Arden were the father and stepmother of Mary Arden and it is therefore at Glebe Farm that she would have lived until she married John Shakespeare and moved to Stratford in 1557. EXTERIOR: Front (roadside) elevation of hall/kitchen range has heavy close-studding with mid-rail and straight braces from wall-posts to wall-plate; the plain rendered area roughly to the centre with the prominent red brick ridge stack directly above marks the original gable end of the hall. This has 3 leaded mullioned windows on ground floor and 2 gabled eaves dormers with leaded mullioned windows, one to each bay; kitchen bay has nail-studded plank door to far right and 2 leaded mullioned windows on ground floor; 2 gabled eaves dormers with leaded mullioned windows; prominent integral brick end stack to gable end, which has bread oven projection. Cross-wing to right has herringbone-patterned gable flush with hall range, ground floor with large leaded mullioned window and nail-studded plank door; first floor with centrally placed leaded mullioned window directly beneath tie beam. Return of cross-wing is square panelled with 3-light leaded mullioned window to left of centre on ground floor; clear signs of truncation to rear gable, which has 3-light leaded mullioned window directly above tie beam. Rear elevation of main range is also square panelled save for small area of close studding directly above entrance which is immediately to the right of the ridge stack and aligned with the front entrance to form a cross-passage; small leaded mullioned windows on ground floor, 2 grouped together to right of door and one to left of door; further leaded mullioned window directly below eaves to left of door; timber-framed catslide lean-to to left is square panelled with red brick infill and overlaps rear gable of cross-wing.

INTERIOR: Ground floor of hall-range is a large room with chamfered spine beam and joists; large inglenook fireplace with timber lintel; stone flag floor; C20 oak stair to first floor. Much of the timber frame in the cross-wing is C20 reinstatement; stone flag floor and C20 staircase. Lean-to at rear is stepped down and has a stone sink. First floor has wide floor boards and a trenched-purlin queen-post roof, lightly sooted over the hall; internal window looks from the cross-wing into the hall.

HISTORY: This building has traditionally been identified as the childhood home of Shakespeare's mother, Mary Arden, an association first made by the local antiquary, John Jordan in 1794. Recent research shows that it was in fact built and occupied by Adam Palmer, a prosperous yeoman who died in 1584.
