

# **Action Plan**

### Introduction

The Wilmcote and Pathlow Village Opinion Survey has identified the issues that residents consider to be important both in the short term and for the next 10 years.

This has been a consensus exercise and we have all had several opportunities to express our opinions. The issues that have been identified are many and wide-ranging and broadly fall into two categories:

- A. Those that require discussion and negotiation with bodies such as Warwickshire Council, the Police, Stratford District Council and the Parish Council. For example establishing a 30mph limit throughout Wilmcote.
- B. Those that Wilmcote and Pathlow will have to take on board and be responsible for with outside advice and in some cases financial support. The provision of a play area for under 12s is a good example.

The Countryside Agency states that " Parish Plans should identify actions which can be taken forward by the parish council, by other individuals and groups within the community or by other service providers and statutory bodies."

The Working Group has drawn up an Action Plan covering the issues that have been identified. The Action Plan is endorsed by and has been formally adopted as policy by the Parish Council. The next stage is implementation and it must be reiterated that all the work that will be involved in progressing the issues is too large to be carried out by the Parish Council or the Parish Plan Working Group. In fact the work of the Parish Plan Working Group is now almost complete and it will be disbanded. The Countryside Agency advises that an effective way of ensuring progress is to establish task groups that will take responsibility for action in specific areas and report back to a steering committee (to be formed) and / or the Parish Council.

We now need committed volunteers to form task groups - if these volunteers are not forthcoming, it is likely that many of the issues identified for action will not get off the ground.

### **Task Groups**

Taking the Parish Plan forward requires Task Groups who will be responsible for making the items in the Action Plan happen. This will be a challenging and satisfying exercise - one that will have a very positive effect on the quality of life in Wilmcote and Pathlow. Your involvement is required as follows:

- 1. In the Village Opinion Survey a large number of residents indicated that they would like to be involved with,
  - # Neighbourhood Watch
- # Facilities for teenagers (Youth Club)
- # Facilities for under 12s (Play Area)

- we need to know who you are so please sign the yellow form.
- 2. It is necessary to form Task Groups to progress actions related to a wide range of issues such as speed limits throughout Wilmcote and bringing Broadband into Wilmcote.
